Assistant Student Services Director Report

Board Report for December 8, 2022 Shelly Patrick Assistant Director of Student Services and Student Learning and Skills Recovery Director

Continued working with Jennifer Crum for implementation of the Leading Change Plan:

- 1. The Communication Guidelines and Hierarchical Communications Flowchart have helped streamline communication with the Related Service Providers. Providers have mentioned the process of communication as I've visited the districts.
- 2. Caseload Survey Jen and I will be working with the Leads to revise the Caseload Survey. The Providers have also suggested that there may not be a need to collect the data 4 times a year. We are meeting as a team on Jan 10th to hear thoughts from the Leads about how to revise this goal.
- 3. Our Related Services Network was held virtually on 11/9/2022. Margie Spino and Jennifer Barnes, Education Program Consultants from the Office of Early Learning and School Readiness spoke with the Related Service Providers about Updates related to Providers for Pre-School. Tom Main, the Early Childhood Consultant from SST7 was also present.
 - I've worked with Joanna Greenwalt, our Lead School Psychologist to plan their Network for Jan. 25th, and Carrie Wood will be talking with them about the Dyslexia Law and how it relates to their work.
 - I'm also working with Sarah Mace, the OT Lead; Johanna Gilland, the SLP Lead; and Shannon Landin, the PT Lead to plan the Related Services Network on Jan. 25th. We will have a presentation by the PIP team at Northmor about their processes and how it has helped with their therapy time and establishing relationships with the staff. Then we will break into teams to focus on specific areas for their needs.
- 4. I have completed visitations to see our Related Service Providers and School Psychologists at the following schools: Mansfield, Madison, Plymouth, Hillsdale, Crestline, and Shelby St. Mary's. I also visited Northmor to experience their Life Skills class which is supported by two of our providers. While there, I also experienced PIP, which is time when our Providers rotate to the K-4 classrooms to provide whole class instruction/activities. This provides them the opportunity to provide services to all students, but also keep an eye on students who have been referred and are going through the RTI process. It also allows them to identify students they may want to screen if they are continually seeing a deficit. In addition to this, I visited the Mansfield Pre-School to observe the Play Based Assessment process.
- 5. We received two recognition forms for our Providers from 11/9 to 12/8. I delivered a certificate to Lexington for Julia Pilla and another to Plymouth for Jessica Lebold.

We will be meeting with the Leads for them to provide feedback on the Leading Change Plan from their teams and look at revisions and additions to the goals to continually hear the needs of our staff.

Continued to provide support to Jolene Edwards as she is transitioning to the principal position at Abraxas.

I've provided support to Crestline Schools Special Education Department on 11/14. In addition, I worked with Candy and Crestline's Tech department to set up a Google calendar for Providers to enter their days in district. They will use the Google calendar to communicate to the team any changes to their calendar throughout the school year.
